#### Council Committees October 2024

<u>Performance and Strategy Committee</u> the following recommendations were put to Council for approval:

THAT **the Performance & Strategy Committee recommends to Council** that the 2023/2024 General Rate Surplus of \$628,025 is transferred as follows:

a. \$578,025 to the General Accounting Reserve Fund to contribute towards expected costs associated with claims against Council relating to water ingress (leaky building) and other structural defects and legislative changes

#### b. \$50,000 to fund Mana Whenua Forums

Cr Raumati voted against the above motion and requested her dissenting vote to be recorded.

Road Stopping Request: Ashwell Crescent, Hopuhopu THAT the Waikato District Council

a. approves the proposal to stop 9,207m<sup>2</sup> of road shown as F on SO 58672 and known as Ashwell Crescent;

b. approves entering into a Road Stopping Agreement with Waikato Tainui, setting out the terms and conditions on which the Council has agreed to the proposed stopping of Ashwell Crescent;

c. subject to both parties' execution of a Road Stopping Agreement, approves submission to the Minister for Land Information requesting a decision to stop Ashwell Crescent and for that road to remain vested in Waikato District Council;

d. subject to the stopping of Ashwell Crescent, and to the vesting of the first stage of internal Hopuhopu Residential Precinct Road vesting in Council, approves staff taking the necessary action to amalgamate the stopped road (formerly Ashwell Crescent) with Waikato Tainui's adjoining land, held in record of title SA57C/456;

e. subject to the stopping of Ashwell Crescent, approves the registration of services easements in favour utility operators; and

f. delegates to the Chief Executive the authority to negotiate and conclude agreements on terms to protect Council's interests and execute all relevant documentation to give effect to this resolution Meremere Community Development Committee Incorporated and Hilltop Community Fellowship Leases of 65 Te Puea Avenue, Meremere

THAT the Waikato District Council

a. approves the granting of two separate leases at 65 Te Puea Avenue, Meremere, subject to positive engagement with mana whenua; that is:

i. to grant a lease to the Meremere Community Development Committee Incorporated to occupy part of the building comprising approximately 83m<sup>2</sup>;

ii. to grant a lease to the Hilltop Community Fellowship of part of the building comprising approximately 79m2;

iii. both lease areas more specifically outlined in yellow on the plans in Attachments 1 and being part of Section Lot 111 DPS 47625 for a term of 2 years with 2 rights of renewal for 2 years each (6 years total); and

iv. delegates to the Chief Operating Officer authority to execute all relevant documentation to give effect to the resolution.
