	Issue	Area	Action
1.	CCTV Update	Mel Tarawhiti, Facilities Services Manager	Detailed design is still underway. There has been a slight delay with these, but work has continued, and we have completed two towns, and four towns have had survey work completed. We would expect the final designs to be completed by mid-March at the latest and will update if this milestone isn't reached.
2.	 Climate Change Presentation Set up a meeting to discuss further (and support), including a multi-purpose strategy with the Meremere Development Committee. 	R Goddard	The Climate Action and Sustainability Team will meet with the Resilience Team this March to discuss and scope this. We are also collating examples of community resilience projects and possible funding avenues. We will meet with the committee in March/April to understand community resilience aspirations and share information and support where possible.
3.	 Tennis Courts, Pavillion and Gym Explore courts on LTP and understand if Meremere is on the list and if not why? Review/assess (may have been on already done by Council) tennis pavilion. 	Cr Raumati	 Currently the fencing pathway, gate, and basketball hoop are scheduled for renewal, and this will happen in the coming year (2025-26). The two courts are not scheduled for renewal until between 2027-29 but there is operational maintenance planned in the coming months. Please see Mel's email re the tennis pavilion.
4.	 Berms Can the title owner be charged for maintenance? Check with Policy Team. 	S Flay	 Unfortunately, there are limited options available to Council if an owner refuses to maintain their property. Under legislation, Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) is responsible for dealing with any fire hazards, including vegetation that may present a fire risk (i.e. overgrown berms). Legally, Council is unable to deal with those issues because we cannot take action on

			aspects that are outside our jurisdiction. The FENZ website contains useful information, including how to report an issue. However, it is unlikely that an overgrown berm would not meet their criteria for a fire hazard. www.fireandemergency.nz/outdoor-and-rural-fire-safety/councils- and-community/fire-hazards-in-your-community/
			• If it is an overgrown section with hazards or potential for health nuisance such as rats or vermin, then Council can investigate under Health Act 1956. In this situation, Council would work with the owner/landlord to find a solution. However, there is very little Council can do if they refuse to maintain it. Enforcement options under the Health Act are limited.
			• Council is unable to carry out maintenance and then collect costs from the owner.
			Council's recommendation to MCC: The committee are encouraged to put in a Service Request to Council, so that it is recorded. The Open Spaces team does not see this as viable for a contractor to mow the berm when they are carrying out maintenance work on the reserve.
