Helenslee Road Footpath(s)	Service Delivery	June The committee want a schedule of footpaths/roadworks. They do not believe that the footpaths are being put where they should be – need to meet with the Alliance on site and take a tour of Pokeno – need to ensure that it is quite clear on a map where the Committee is requiring the footpaths. FYI - Footpaths – safety issues with schools and daycares Could MOE get involved in the footpath connections by school – what are the requirements of MOE.	 The footpath at the intersection of Pokeno Road & Helenslee Road is commencing within a month. This footpath will run from the entrance of Pokeno School on Pokeno Road, run around the intersection, up Helenslee Road and towards the Kea crossing. The footpath at the intersection of Helenslee Road and Munro Road (outside the cemetry) will commence after the Pokeno School footpath. Both footpaths are only temporary due to planned changes in intersection designs in the future. Please note that Ian Cathcart, General Manager Service Delivery will provide a verbal update re "Pokeno Footpaths" at the meeting.
Rubbish / Recycling Bins in Main Street	Service Delivery/ Luke M	Can Pokeno have a rubbish bin outside the toilets? Is it possible to get recycling bins next to the main rubbish bins in Main Street?	 AUGUST: Yes – will be addressed as part of the redevelopment of the toilet block. SEPTEMBER: A rubbish bin is being incorporated into the Toilet Project. OCTOBER: A preliminary scope of works is underway for the proposed toilets in Pokeno and is expected to be completed by mid-December. Once that work has been completed staff will be in a position to provide an update to the Community Committee on a timeline. NOVEMBER: A compactor bin is proposed for the site. This is to reduce the number of intersections connecting to Pokeno Road over such a short distance (Helenslee Road, new Hitchen Access road, Ford Road Great South Road). This was originally planned for 2021 but is currently programmed for the 2018/19 construction season (October 2018 to April 2019). This will be dependent on timing for adjacent urban upgrade works on Pokeno Road. The Great South Road (GSR) end of Ford Road will be upgraded along with the adjacent GSR urban upgrade works currently programmed for 2019/20 construction season.
			Timing may change to fit with adjacent private developments.

Road Plans for Rail Overbridge at northern end of Pokeno including Pokeno Road

New subdivision proposals are triggering additional assessments of the needs of the transport corridors as we seek to put in place a safe and effective network. In some cases temporary solutions such as at Munro Rd/Helenslee Rd intersection, are being implemented as we wait for large residential subdivisions adjacent to work their way along the planning and construction timeline.

Roading staff are coordinating with our other departments such as Waters (for water supply, stormwater and wastewater), as well as external utilities providers to prioritise the works and minimise repeated disturbance of roads, providing infrastructure fit for purpose for the foreseeable future, and to be more efficient with our spends. Sometimes this results in mismatches at the interface between old and new developments for a short period such as at Pokeno Rd with the upcoming road connection over the rail overbridge from the Hitchen block.

There are a number of urban upgrades proposed for Pokeno including Pokeno Road and Great South Road and the associated intersections, to occur over the next three year period and beyond. These upgrades will be timed to support road safety, the increase in traffic flows, and the efficient use of funds.
