The Waikato District Council (WDC) holds a resource consent to discharge treated wastewater to ground from the Maramarua wastewater treatment system. Waikato District Council in conjunction with Watercare Services Limited operates the facility under the resource consents issued by Waikato Regional Council. A new consent was granted on the 15th December 2014 and will expire on the 15th December 2039.

ANNUAL REPORT

JULY 2023 - JUNE 2024

The Maramarua Wastewater Treatment Plant is expected to operate in compliance with the conditions of Resource Consent 132607. Important matters to note and non-compliances are detailed below against the corresponding consent condition.

A summary of results above attached as Appendix 1 summary spreadsheet.

Conditions Comments The activity authorised by this consent shall be carried out in accordance with the application for this 1 resource consent and as identified in the resource consent conditions below. The site activity is carried out in accordance with the information contained in the application. RC 132607 in effect as of 15/12/2014. 3 The consent holder shall ensure that contractors are made aware of the conditions of this resource consent and ensure compliance with those conditions. All contractors employed at the treatment site are inducted in both health and safety procedures and relevant conditions of this consent. 4 The average daily discharge volume of treated wastewater discharged to the Wisconsin Mound shall not exceed 5 m^3 per day. This is to be calculated on a rolling 12-month period basis. Compliant - Average daily discharge volume of treated wastewater discharged to the Wisconsin Mound was recorded just over the limit at 3.2 m³. The 90th percentile daily discharge volume of treated wastewater discharged to the Wisconsin Mound shall 5 not exceed 8 m³ per day. To determine compliance with the 90th percentile limit, no more than 10 percent of daily discharge volume totals shall exceed the specified limits. This is to be calculated on a rolling 12 month period basis. Non-Compliant - 90th percentile daily flow for July 2023 to June 2024 was measured to be 22 m³. The consent holder shall ensure that the quality of the discharge to the Wisconsin Mound shall comply with 6(a) the following limits: The 90th percentile daily discharge of Carbonaceous Biochemical Oxygen Demand (cBOD) shall not exceed 20 mqL⁻¹. To determine compliance with the 90th percentile limit, no more than one sample in any ten consecutive monthly sampling events shall exceed the specified limits. This is to be calculated on a rolling basis for the previous 12 month period Compliant - The 90th percentile value was calculated to be 1.7 mg/L. The 90th percentile daily discharge of Suspended Solids (SS) shall not exceed 30 mgL⁻¹. To determine compliance with the 90th percentile limit, no more than one sample in any ten consecutive monthly sampling events shall exceed the specified limits. This is to be calculated on a rolling basis for the previous 12 month period.

Compliant - The 90th percentile value was calculated to be 9.6 mg/L



Conditions Comments

- 6(b) The consent holder shall determine the concentration of wastewater contaminants in the treated wastewater discharged to land by collecting samples for analysis at a point prior to the application to the Wisconsin Mound for the following determinants:
 - 1. Nitrate Nitrogen (NO3-N)
 - 2. Ammoniacal Nitrogen (NH4-N)
 - 3. Escherichia coli (E. coli)
 - 4. Suspended Solids (SS)
 - 5. Carbonaceous Biological Oxygen Demand (cBOD)

Samples should be collected on a monthly basis (12 samples per year) this sampling frequency can be reduced after two years' worth of samples if the consent holder applies to Waikato Regional Council in writing.

- Please see the attached Appendix 1 summary spreadsheet. 12 months of data has been collected to this point.
- Nitrate: Measured 90%ile = 61 mg/L
- Ammoniacal Nitrogen: Measured 90%ile = 1.7 mg/L
- E.coli: Measured 90%ile = 576 cfu/100ml
- Carbonaceous Biological Oxygen Demand (cBOD): Measured 90%ile = 1.7 mg/L
- Suspended Solids (SS)s: Measured 90%ile = 9.6 mg/L
- 7 The discharge shall be uniformly distributed over the wastewater disposal area (Wisconsin Mound)
 - Disposal mount is regularly inspected.
- The consent holder shall ensure that the wastewater treatment and disposal system is properly operated and maintained at all times.
 - The site is regularly attended and inspected.
 - Construction and upgrade works for the disposal field have commenced.
- As a result of the operation of the wastewater treatment plant the discharge shall not result in odour that is objectionable to the extent that it causes an adverse effect at/or beyond the boundary of the subject property.
 - Council's CRM database records all complaints from the public. There were no odour complaints from the public during the consent year regarding the Maramarua WWTP.
- 10 The consent holder shall retain and update as necessary the Operation and Management Plan for the site.
 - An Operations & Management Plan is retained for this site. The Maramarua Operations & Management Plan was subjected to an initial review by the Watercare team and is attached in the 2021-2022 Annual Report.
 - Planning is underway with a wastewater to conduct a detailed review and update of the Maramarua Operation & Management Plan.

Conditions Comments

- The consent holder shall undertake annual monitoring of the surface water drains at the following points NZTM 179541BE 5875477N (Coalfields Road) and NZTM 1795452E and 5375491N (Kopuku Lane) and the on-site bore within the WWTP at NZTM 1795430E 5875-t91N at a suitable time when there is flow within the drains. The sample should be analysed for the same determinants as listed in condition 6 above.
 - Sampling has been completed for the Coalfields Road and Kopuku Lane surface water drains and results are attached as Appendix 3.
 - No on-site bore has been identified by the Production team at the documented consent coordinates.
 The consent sampling plan on-site bore location is not consistent with the WRC online bores map. A
 bore is located in a neighbouring property. Watercare will seek clarification from WRC on the correct
 bore to be sampled.
- The consent holder shall forward the results of the monitoring undertaken pursuant to conditions 4, 5, 6 and 19 to the Waikato Regional Council, via electronic means, within one month of receipt of the results by the consent holder.
 - Monthly reports forwarded to WRC with comments/investigation details included for any noncompliances observed.
- The consent holder shall notify the Waikato Regional Council within 24 hours (where practicable) of the consent holder becoming aware of the limits specified in conditions 4, 5 and 6 of this resource consent being exceeded, or any accidental discharge, plant breakdown or other circumstance which is likely to result in the limits of this consent being exceeded. The consent holder shall, within 10 working days of the incident occurring, provide a written report to the Waikato Regional Council, identifying the breach, possible causes and steps to ensure future compliance.
 - All incidents are notified to WRC as required.
- The consent holder shall maintain and keep a complaint register for all aspects of all operations at the site. The register shall detail the date, time, duration and type of complaint, cause of the complaint, and action taken by the consent holder in response to the complaint. The consent holder shall forward to the Council a copy of all complaints received as soon as practicable. The register shall be made available to the Council upon request at any reasonable time and a copy shall be forwarded to the Waikato Regional Council by 30 September each year.
 - Councils CRM database records all complaints from the public. No complaints were received for the Maramarua WWTP. Appendix 4 is attached as evidence of a complaints register.
- The Waikato Regional Council may during 2019, 2024, 2029 and 2034 serve notice on the consent holder under section 128 (1) of the Resource Management Act 1991, of its intention to review the conditions of this resource consent for the following purposes:
 - to review the effectiveness of the conditions of these resource consents in avoiding or mitigating any adverse effects on the environment and if necessary to avoid, remedy or mitigate such effects by way of further or amended conditions; or
 - if necessary and appropriate, to require the holder of this resource consent to adopt the best practicable option to remove or reduce adverse effects on the surrounding environment; or
 - to review the adequacy of and the necessity for monitoring undertaken by the consent holder.
