Te Wherowhero title land is held by Custodian Trustees for the benefit of all Waikato. The former Hopuhopu military base, now the site of Waikato- Tainui College for Research and Development and other activities, is in Te Wherowhero title. The district plan addresses this land differently from other Maori land. Business and Residential zoned areas at Hopuhopu are subject to the plan provisions that apply to those zones. The remainder of Hopuhopu is a specific site in the Rural Zone.</p> <p>AND</p> <p>Add a new point to Section 2.6 - Powers to set aside Maori Land for special purposes, (b), as follows:</p> <p>(b) The district plan adopts a different approach to land at Hopuhopu in Te Wherowhero title. Rural Zoned land is identified as a specific site, enabling a range of activities appropriate to the aspirations of the Waikato Raupatu Claims Settlement Act 1995 and the Deed creating the Waikato Raupatu Lands Trust (1995.)
